TOP RIDING TIP

Tips to Improve your Lower Leg Position

The rider's entire leg including their lower leg should be loose with the joints of the hip, knee and ankle softly flexed. This will allow the rider to remain in balance with the horse through the gaits, let the spine do its job of absorbing the horse's movement and facilitate effective use of the rider's lower leg to encourage the horse to draw forward.

- Don't try to hold your leg in a good riding position this will create tension up the leg through to the hip and make it harder for you to sit in balance with the horse and use your leg effectively.
- Work without stirrups regularly riding without stirrups will help improve your seat and balance and allow you to develop a soft lower leg.
- Don't ride with your stirrups too long This is a common problem where the longer the leg the better seems to be a common mantra. The stirrup iron should gently support the toe, if the stirrup is too long then the rider will end up 'paddling' and tipping forward – have the stirrups for the correct length for your leg and the type of saddle you are riding in.

NO FILMING POLICY
